Your child is now going to be working with closed syllables that have five sounds. These are words that usually have a blend (two consonants each with their own sound) at the beginning of the word and a blend at the end of the word. The word "s I u m p" is an example. The sI is a blend and the mp is a blend. I will be adding the suffixes s, ed (/ed/ or /id/), and ing to these five sound words as well (as long as the base word is unchanging). Remember that your child should spell the base word first, then add the suffix ending
